



Sri Aurobindo Ashram: The founder of Aurobindo Ashram, Sri Aurobindo Ghosh established it with the aim to help people attain inner peace and moksha. He laid down its foundation on November 24th in 1926 when he was surrounded by disciples after retirement from politics. The Ashram is renowned for its amazing structure, including a library and main building that can be accessed only with gate passes from the Bureau Central or guest houses inside. There's also an entire spiritual center made up of four houses where Mother and Sri Aurobindo lived for different intervals during their lifetime.






Auroville: Auroville is an experimental township established in 1968 with the vision of creating a universal city dedicated to human unity and sustainable living. This international community attracts people from all over the world who live together in harmony. The township's iconic Matrimandir, a golden globe-shaped meditation hall, symbolizes the central aim of Auroville, which is to foster peace and unity among people of all cultures and backgrounds.

Manakula Vinayagar Temple: Situated behind the Raj Niwas, Manakula Vinayagar ancient temple is dedicated to Lord Ganesha. The ancient Hindu shrine is estimated to have been established around five centuries ago. The Manakula Vinayagar Temple is a magnificent example of South Indian architecture. The traditional Dravidian style can be seen in all its glory with beautifully decorated friezes and stucco figurines. The sanctum houses a grand idol of Vinayaka called Vellakkaran Pillai.






Kargil War Memorial: The Puducherry Kargil War Memorial is a tribute to the valor and sacrifice of Indian soldiers who fought in the Kargil War of 1999. Situated along the scenic Beach Road in White Town, Puducherry, the memorial serves as a poignant reminder of the conflict and the soldiers' bravery. It features plaques and inscriptions that honor the fallen heroes, providing visitors with a place to reflect and pay their respects.



Seafront Promenade: Rock Beach or the Promenade Beach as it is commonly referred to by locals, offers a magnificent view of telluric sunsets over crystal clear water. Besides enjoying the stunning scenery you can relish drool-worthy seafood and coffee at the beachside cafes. The beach also has several significant landmarks such as the old Heritage Townhall, the old lighthouse, Dupleix's Statue, the War Memorial, and the statue of Mahatma Gandhi.





Chunnambar Boat House: A creek borders the Chunnambar boathouse on one side, and lush green meadows replete with waterfall backdrops that complete the exquisiteness and elegance of the place. The pristine sand and turquoise water are a relaxing experience. The ride along the backwaters in the Chunnambar boathouse is an experience by itself. The backwaters are situated at the junction of the Chunnambar River and the Bay of Bengal. The narrow winding strip is laden with green escapades, offering a breath-taking sight to all on board.

French Quarter (White Town): The French Quarter, also known as White Town, is one of the most charming areas in Puducherry. The colonial style French villas have huge compounds, grand walls and majestic doors. This defines the French lifestyle of keeping their personal and social life to themselves behind the high walls. With its tree-lined streets, vibrant cafes, and colonial-era buildings, this area reflects the blend of French and Tamil culture that defines the city.





Pondicherry's Marina Beach: Pondy Marina Beach is a vibrant new addition to Pondicherry's coastline, offering a blend of leisure, culture, and scenic beauty. Located just south of the famous Promenade Beach, it features wide walkways, food stalls, eco-friendly installations, and recreational zones. With its clean surroundings and relaxed vibe, it's a perfect spot to enjoy the sea breeze, local cuisine, and beautiful sunrises.

Paradise beach: Paradise Beach, also known as Plage Paradiso, is one of Pondicherry's most popular tourist spots. Accessible via a scenic 30-minute ferry ride through mangrove-lined backwaters, the journey itself is a treat for nature lovers and photographers. The beach offers shacks for fresh coconut water and local snacks. While the waters are rough and not ideal for swimming, visitors can enjoy fishing or indulge in various water sports, making it a perfect spot for both relaxation and adventure.





Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus: The Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Pondicherry is a Roman Catholic church built by French missionaries in 1908 and was elevated to the status of a basilica in 2011, becoming one of only 21 such basilicas in India. It is the largest church in Puducherry, designed in Roman-Byzantine style with a unique Latin-rite cross layout, measuring 50 meters in length, 48 meters in width, and 18 meters in height. The church is renowned for its stunning stained glass windows, 24 intricately engraved columns with biblical inscriptions, and images of 28 saints devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, making it a prominent spiritual and architectural landmark in South India.

Arikamedu: A historical site and a place for all history-buffs located on the outskirts of Puducherry, Arikamedu is a bridge between Roman and Indian architecture. An archaeological site maintained by the Archaeological Society of India, it is surrounded by moss-laden walls and brick structures that stand testament to the entirety of Rome and Greece in a couple of square meters. Arikamedu was accidentally discovered during an archaeological excavation in around 1945. Interestingly, Arikamedu had an urban settlement between 1000 BC to 100 AD.





French War Memorial: The French memorial is dedicated to the war heroes of World War I who sacrificed their lives to save the country. Reconstructed in 1970, it is one of the most pristine places to visit in Puducherry. You will find a bronze statue of bas-relief situated right behind the main monument that marks the arrival of Duplex in 1742. On 14th July every year, the entire memorial comes alive with glittering lights to commemorate the martyrdom of the soldiers and a chance to celebrate their life.
